






Tidy Towns and Local Area Involvement



Cumani Roche organised and ran a very successful Halloween Fun Day. It was a great opportunity for both staff and students to take time out from academic work and have some fun.








Ciara Curtin organised and ran a table quiz for both staff and students. This was to remind everyone to mind their mental health and that having fun can help this.
