Limerick Area Post-Primary Schools Common Application System 2014/15

Information Sheet

What is the Limerick Area Post-Primary Schools Common Application System?

The Limerick Area Post-Primary Schools Common Application System is the process by which the transfer of 6th class primary school students to the participating post-primary schools is managed.

Which Post-Primary Schools participate in the system?

There are 17 participant post-primary schools. The schools participating in the 2014/15 system are as follows;-

What are the criteria of admission to a post-primary school?

Each participating post-primary school has unique admissions criteria, details of which can be found in the School's Admission Policy. Copies of this policy may be obtained by contacting the schools directly.

How do I make an application for 1st year student enrolment to a participating post-primary school?

In order to make an application for the academic year 2014/15 you must complete the Limerick Area Post-Primary Schools Common Application Form. This form will be made available at all participating post-primary school Open Days/Nights for prospective 1st year students. A copy has also been sent to all identified feeder primary schools.

When completing the form it is important that you indicate a minimum of 9 schools to which you are applying in genuine, descending order of choice as a failure to do so may result in your child not being

5. Chief Executive's Report

Progress Report on Amalgamation

The CE updated the Board in relation to ongoing progress in the consolidation of the LCETB and paid tribute to all involved.

Inaugural Meeting of the St. Nessan's & Salesian Steering Group

Members were pleased to note that the inaugural meeting of the Steering Group had been held in the Greenhills hotel on Thursday 5th December. All stakeholders were represented at the meeting. The Board wished the project well.

Saint Enda's Celebrates Forty Years in Education

The CE advised the Board that St. Enda's Community School had recently celebrated its fortieth year in education in a most appropriate way and tribute was paid to all involved.

BT Young Scientist Competition

The CE referred to the significant number of projects from LCETB schools that had qualified and been accepted for the 2014 BT Young Scientist Competition in January 2014. Tribute was paid to all of the students, teachers, schools and families involved.

Meeting with Student Support Team Co-ordinators

The Board was informed that a meeting of Student Support Team Co-ordinators was facilitated recently to review the operation of the SST and plan for further supports. The development of a resource pack for critical incidents for all ETB schools is at an advanced stage.

Working Group on Bullying Procedures

A number of meetings of the Working Group on Bullying Procedures, representative of LCETB schools, have been held recently. This is in preparation for the implementation of the revised Anti-Bullying Policy during 2014.

Helping Parents support their children in School

Members noted that a seminar "Working in Partnership, Helping Parents support their children in School," was organised in order to promote improved integration between Community Education and HSCL Staff in Schools.

Limerick College of Further Education

It was noted that the inaugural meeting of the Board of Management of Limerick College of Further Education, (LCFE), took place on 27th November 2013. The Members and CE who congratulated students of LCFE who were presented with their Skills for Work Certificates in a recent graduation ceremony.

Principals' Forum

Members welcomed the establishment of a forum for Principals from across the LCETB area and also noted a similar forum was established for Further Education and Training.

Clare Music Generation

The CE was pleased to inform the Board that the Clare Music Education Partnership application to Music Generation had been successful and he warmly congratulated all involved, The Board also paid tribute to all concerned.

With regard to Music Generation Limerick City, Cllr. Kieran O'Hanlon expressed his concern that traditional Irish Music and items with Irish language content were not being promoted by the project and expressed his hope that Music Generation Clare would include more Irish Music and Irish language content in their project. The Education and Training Officer gave a detailed account of the provision of music in Limerick City, which was welcomed by the Members and explained that this was a three year programme with the initial orientation on young people with particular emphasis on the primary school age group. The Board paid tribute to the Education and Training Officer for his work in this regard.

Buildings Report

The CE referred to building matters and a comprehensive report was presented by the Head of Building and Procurement on the various capital projects currently in hand. The Board was pleased to note same and also the number of projects seeking funding under the Summer Works Scheme for 2014. The CE and Members paid tribute to the Head of Building and Procurement on the work to date.

The CE referred to the recent election of Mr. Padraig Flanagan, Principal Castletroy College, as President of the NAPD and the Board and CE wished him well in his Presidency.

The Board noted also that Mr. Noel Malone, Principal, Colaiste Chiarain, Croom, had been invited to present to the Department of Education and Skills on the New Curriculum for the revised Junior Certificate Programme.

The Board also noted that Mr. Donncha Ó Treasaigh, Principal, Gaelcholaiste Luimnigh, was involved in a number of national initiatives.
