EDUCATION REPORT

New Community College in Mungret

Mr. Liam O'Mahoney has been appointed as Principal of the new school in Mungret. Liam is currently Principal in St. John Bosco Community College in Kildysart and will be taking up his position in February. Discussions are ongoing with the Department of Education and Skills and Limerick City & County Council on the location of the temporary accommodation. An information evening for prospective students was held on Thursday 24th November in the South Court Hotel at 8pm with well in excess of six hundred people in attendance.

The Board noted the closing date for Common Applications System applications had elapsed and the CE advised that he would provide a further report on the uptake for the new College at the next Board Meeting.

Address by Mr. Séamus Conboy, ETBI Primary School Support Officer on Community National Schools

Mr. Seamus Conboy presented to the Board on the Community National Schools that are state-governed, multidenominational, inclusive schools that welcome all children from the local communities they serve. Mr. Conboy informed the Board that the Community National Schools (CNS) is a new alternative under the patronage of ETBs. Members noted that since their establishment in 2008 that there are currently 11 schools and patronage had now transferred to the ETBs since September, 2016. Mr. Conboy briefed

Members on the characteristic spirit of a CNS. Members noted that support services for the schools i.e. Finance, HR, IT and Procurement and how this benefits the Principal in the management of the schools. Members paid tribute to Mr. Conboy for his informed presentation and wished him well in his role as ETBI Primary School Support Officer.
