5. Chief Executive's Report

Principals and Deputies Forum

A key strategic aim is the support of the senior management team in schools. As part of this strategy, a meeting of Principals and Deputies took place on Tuesday, 20th January, and each member of the Head Office Senior Management Team presented on current services. The session was an opportunity to identify current issues and potential supports for schools. Further sessions are planned.

Whole School Numeracy - Planning session for Numeracy Link

A session for numeracy link teachers was facilitated by the EO, the Limerick Education Centre and Mr. Jerry McCarthy formally JCSP on Tuesday 9th December. Four schools presented on their numeracy journey to date. A further session is planned in the Spring.

Whole School Evaluation - Management, Leadership and Learning

St. Anne's Community College in Killaloe commenced their MLL in the week commencing 5th January 2015. The reporting inspector who is leading the evaluation is Orlaith O'Connor. The EO attended Board presentations on Wednesday, 7th January and Wednesday, 21st January.

Board of Management Directive from Minister of Education and Skills

The existing Boards of Management will cease on 31st March 2015. The 20km determination will create significant challenges in the establishment of Boards for schools and centres.

Youth Capital Funding 2014/2015

Dr James Reilly TD, Minister for Children and Youth Affairs, announced the availability of €.5 million capital funding for small to medium capital grants to youth projects in disadvantaged communities in 2014.

The applications for type one were assessed in mid-November with recommendations to the DCYA. he total allocation to LCETB is € 29,500. Members noted the following successful projects;

St. Nessan's & Salesians Amalgamation Process

Significant progress towards the development of Thomond Community College continues to be made. Mr. Eamon Murphy Head of Procurement and Capital attended a meeting of the Steering group prior to Christmas to examine the infrastructural aspects of the process. A number of task groups with representatives of all stakeholders, students, parents and staff has been actively engaged in the development, through a uniform, curriculum and code of behaviour task groups. The Minister for Education and Skills Ms. Jan O'Sullivan TD officially launched Thomond Community College on Friday 16th January. The launch included the official unveiling of the school name, mission, crest, and uniform. The launch focused on two aspects of added value associated with the amalgamation; broader curriculum choices and a focus on the sciences. The occasion marked the commencement of the long-term plan to develop the school as a school for all over the next number of years. Clir. Elena Secas, who attended the launch, congratulated all involved The Board paid tribute to all involved.

Section 29 Appeal Hearing

A Section 29 Appeal Hearing was held in Ennis on Monday 15th December in relation to the appeal of a suspension in Ennis Community College. The report of the sub-committee was adopted by the Board.

Youth Guarantee

Ireland is now recovering from the greatest financial and jobs crisis in its history. The crises had a particularly negative impact on young people. Between 2008 and 2013, the rate of youth unemployment across the EU increased from 16% to 24%. The Youth Guarantee supported by centre EU funding of €6bn, aims to ensure young people are supported to reengage with the labour market. Work is already underway with LCETB and other schools in the early identification and referral and engagement of early school leavers.

BT Young Scientist Competition

Another very good year for Limerick and Clare ETB Schools in the BT Young Scientist Awards. Congratulations to all students and teachers on the standard and quality of the projects entered.

FURTHER EDUCATION AND TRAINING DIVISION

Hospitality Education & Training Centre

The new Hospitality Education & Training Centre (HETC) was officially opened by Jan O'Sullivan, T.D., Minister for Education & Skills on Monday 15th December. The aim of the Centre is to address the shortfall in suitably qualified staff in the Irish Hospitability Industry.

Led by the Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board (LCETB), supported with funding received from Limerick City and County Council, the newly opened Centre is a partnership project involving SOLAS, the Department of Social Protection, Paul Partnership, Limerick Enterprise Development Partnership, LIT, Failte Ireland, Limerick College of Further Education and representatives from the Hospitality and Tourism sectors.

25 trainees enrolled for a pilot programme which was delivered between September and December, the outcome being 90% (22 trainees) securing jobs in the industry.

Currently, 45 trainees have enrolled for the January cohort across three skill areas – Culinary, Restaurant Service and Bar Skills.

Music Generation Limerick City

Work Plan for MGLC:

- National Schools working in 12 local national schools towards a major combined event in UL
 arena in the summer. Last term each school wrote a school anthem a combined video of
 these will be released shortly.
- Secondary Schools working in 5 secondary schools (1st years) towards a series of videos of original compositions with each group.
- Hubs providing direct tuition to over 200 young people in 3 centres based in regeneration areas.
- Songwriting/Band Explosion mentoring and songwriting programme has received praise from the Arts Council, Music Generation nationally, the National Concert Hall and the Irish Times.
 We are holding a series of gigs and events at LSAD, the Belltable and Dolans. Currently mentoring 15 young bands - over 60 teens.
- Community providing (or setting up) impactful projects in Ceim ar Ceim (Moyross), St Canices, Youthreach, 5B and Limerick prison. Also working with Adapt, Children's Ark and the Alzheimers Society on forthcoming projects.
- Early Years about to roll out an innovative early years programme that will reach every child within the age group across the City. This is being piloted at St. Lelias and Corpus Cristi.
- Music Gen Express currently stationary, acting as a workshop space. It'll start moving again in March (for Patrick's Day).

Music Generation Clare

Work Plan for MGC:

- Development of two instrument banks in Shannon and Kilrush in conjunction with Clare Library Service.
- Establish collection of early years music material for parents. This is to be made available through branch libraries and Clare Library Service.
- Establishment of two tuition centres in Shannon and Kilrush.
- Development of Minimasters Early Years Programme in partnership with Co Clare Childcare Committee.
- Extend the Escalation Singing Programme to 24 Primary Schools.
- Develop CPD for tutors.

SOLAS

A new funding and reporting process has been developed by SOLAS, named FARR (Funding Allocation Request and Reporting). This system will enable reporting on all FET programmes using a single database. This system is the precursor to PLSS (Programme and Learner Support System) that will include a Course Database, a Calendar Database and a Learner Database.

Part-Time Programmes

The part-time programmes under the FET Division include the Back to Education Initiative, Adult Literacy and Community Education Programmes. The Operational Guidelines for BTEI, Adult Literacy and Community Education requires us to ensure that there are specific policies in place at management level to promote a cohesive integrated service approach with regard to all part-time further and adult education programmes, as this will ensure a focus on strategic planning and avoid duplication. Cohesive integrated programmes of adult learning for geographical areas within the LCETB are being developed and build on the structures in place across the full ETB. In Clare, area planning is facilitated across five learning networks while in Limerick City, area planning is facilitated across three learning network areas. It is proposed to extend this approach and build on existing local expertise to strengthen and enhance two formal network areas in Co. Limerick.

Learner Fund

The Learner Fund is an initiative of the Department of Children and Youth Affairs (DCYA). The Learner Fund will provide funding to assist existing staff working directly with children in registered early years services to meet the mandatory minimum qualification requirements being introduced in September 2015.

From September 2015 all staff in early years services need to have full Level 5 qualifications, and all Preschool (ECCE) Room Leaders need a full Level 6 qualification. These minimum qualification requirements will mean that established services have approximately ten months from now to ensure that all staff will be appropriately qualified or have their training substantially completed.

The LCETB is one of the 'Approved' Training Providers approved to deliver courses that meet the requirement for the Learner Fund and are working in cooperation with POBAL and with both of the Childcare Committees in Limerick and Clare.

AONTAS Learner Festival 2015 and Star Awards

Two LCETB Community Education Projects are on the AONTAS Star Awards 2015 shortlist.

St. Saviour's Community Drama Group: St. Saviours Community Drama Group is a vibrant community drama group based in Limerick close to the City centre. The group (20 members) was set up two years ago by St. Saviours Community Education Group, a local learner led voluntary group which co-ordinate community education in the area. The aim of the project is to provide a space for learners to explore their creative side through drama, and to encourage local people through their productions to be involved in their community. Members of the group are very vocal about how being part of the Drama group has increased their self-confidence and their sense of community. Many of them are now active members of the St. Saviours Community Education Committee.

Kilrush Men's Shed Wind Turbine Project: The Kilrush Men's Shed Group is a community group set up in 2012. Since its foundation the group has worked with LCETB who have supported the group in the form of tutor hours advice and support. The group has been highly successful in its projects and to date they have built a small sailboat, a fully functioning wind turbine, and a wind powered water pump. The group are currently at the beginning of a QQI Level 3 Cert. in Woodcraft run by LCETB where they are manufacturing furniture for a community house located on near-by Scattery Island.

Employer Engagement Strategy

An Employer Engagement Strategy has been devised with three central tenets which will enhance engagement with employers through a number of processes:

- a) The establishment of a central information point for employers which will map all local available training provision in the region and provide access to FET education and skills acquisition programmes & apprenticeships.
- b) The establishment of a FET employer forum which will enable employers to articulate their needs re skills acquisition for their labour force. The forum will include engagement with local educational institutions and DSP to develop programmes in line with national labour market intelligence and local needs.
- c) The continued development of the Information & Guidance Service providing guidance for clients as they engage in the progression from training into employment.

FET Guidance Strategy

The current AEIGS guidance team has been extended to include VTOS, PLCs and Youthreach. All those involved in guidance in the FET sector will be involved in designing the Guidance Strategy going forward. The AEIGS team will devise training for other colleagues re the current AEIGS database. All guidance interventions across FET with groups and individuals will eventually be recorded on a single database.

Youth Guarantee

In responding to the implementation of the Youth Guarantee, the FET Division will offer a collaborative approach through a combination of programmes:

- a. Pre-development QQI Level 2 programme to reach 18-25 LTU provided through LTI.
- b. Places made available in Youthreach and CTC for provision of QQI Level 3- 5 programmes.
- c. Places made available on training centre programmes, QQI Level 4, 5, and 6.
- d. Apprenticeships

The above combination offers a pathway from Level 2 through to apprenticeship and on to work. This would include places on innovative projects such as Hospitality or City & Guilds Forge work Level 2.

QQI External Advisory Panel

An External Advisory Panel will visit LCETB on 27th January to conduct a feasibility study on the draft QA Guidelines for ETBs. The core purpose of this process is to engage directly with the

ETBs in evaluating the overall effectiveness of the draft QA Guidelines to ensure we establish a set of guidelines which provide both stability and a clear roadmap in relation to developing and building on quality of FET within the ETB sector.

The Bog Walk Project

Sixmilebridge/Kilmurry Men's Shed (men's shed group which was formed last year under the guidance of the LCETB Clare Community Education Service) were approached by Elizabeth Brady from Kilkishen Community Development Association enquiring if the group would be interested in assisting in the development of what is more commonly known in the locality as "The Bog Walk".

The Men's Shed saw this as a unique opportunity to establish links and build partnerships with their neighbouring community in addition to learning/developing new skills. The two groups came together under the guidance of Gerry Ruane LCETB Community Ed tutor, to form a partnership and define a programme of work which would meet the joint needs of both the Men's Shed Group and the Kilkishen Community Development Group.

7. Boards of Management

ESTABLISHING BOARDS OF MANAGEMENT

As previously notified, the Minister for Education and Skills has extended the tenure of the existing boards of management for schools and centres of education to 31st March 2015.

Boards of management of schools and centres of education are to be established by the Board in accordance with Section 44 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

The Minister has set out her position in relation to the composition of boards of management of schools and centres of education which is that, to the greatest extent possible, the members of such boards should be drawn from the community which the school or centre of education serves.

On the establishment of the new boards of management, it is the intention of the Department to undertake a survey to establish the distances from schools or centres of education from which the membership of the board is drawn and this will be used to inform future policy considerations.

The payment of travelling expenses to members of boards of management for attendance at meetings will be payable to a maximum of the appropriate rate applicable to a 20 km single journey by private car. Travel costs incurred by members travelling to meetings by bus or train will, where vouched, be reimbursed.

Subsistence allowances will not be payable for attendance at board of management meetings.

The reduction in the number of members on the LCETB Board will mean that the capacity of the Board to provide members for boards of management is limited and may require greater representation from the area in which the school or education centre is based. This is recognised in the ETB Act 2013, Section 44 (12) (c) which envisages a situation where a board of management may have no member from the LCETB Board.

Every decision and act of a board of management established in accordance with the provisions of Section 44 of the ETB Act 2013 will be subject to confirmation by the Board.

Members expressed their disappointment at recent regulations, particularly in relation to where a Board of Management may have no member from the LCETB.

The Chief Executive advised Members that listings for appointments to Boards would issue shortly and that it may prove useful to have a special meeting on this matter. This was agreed.

8. AOB

Following query on Kilmallock extension, Mr. Murphy, Buildings Officer, stated that this project was still on target. Mr. Murphy also clarified that funding for repair of the Gym Wall had been provided by the Department of Education and Skills.

The Chief Executive clarified that Canteen Suppliers are appointed following advertisement and a tendering process.

The Chief Executive advised Members that he had looked at costs involved in providing iPads, but should Members require same, that this could be revisited.

Ms. Shelagh Graham advised the Board that training is being organised for Members in relation to Selection Boards and paid tribute to existing Members of Selection/Interview Boards with regard to same.

Mr. Sean Kennedy paid tribute to all involved in the repair of the wall at Abbeyfeale Education Centre.

Date for next meeting to be advised. It was agreed to circulate a calendar of Meetings at the next Meeting of the Board.
