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Statement of Board Responsibilities

Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

Section 51 of that Act requires the ETB to keep in such form and in respect of such accounting periods as may be approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, all proper and usual accounts of the monies received or expended by it.

In preparing those accounts, the Board is required to:

- (a) apply the standard accounting policies for the preparation of ETB financial statements
- (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- (c) disclose and explain any material departures from the standard accounting policies

The Board is responsible for keeping proper books of account which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Board and which enable it to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with section 51 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

The Board is also responsible for safeguarding its assets and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board (ETB) came into being on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. On that date, LCETB took over the Assets, Liabilities and functions of the former Vocational Education Committee's of Limerick City, Counties Limerick and Clare.

The Code of Governance for ETBs is set out in Circular Letter 02/2019, which was issued by the Department of Education and Skills to all ETBs in January 2019. The Code of Governance 02/2019 was adopted by LCETB at its meeting on 26th February, 2019. Prior to the adoption of The Code of Governance 02/2019 LCETB operated under the Code of Governance 08/2015.

The Audit and Risk Committee met five times in 2019. The Finance Committeee met four times in 2019.

Responsibility for the System of Internal Control

As Chairperson of Limerick & Clare Education and Training Board, I acknowledge the responsibility of the Board for ensuring that an efficient and effective system of internal control is maintained and operated. The system can only provide reasonable and not absolute assurance that assets are safeguarded, transactions are authorised and properly recorded, and that material errors or irregularities are either prevented or would be detected in a timely period. A new board was constituted for Limerick & Clare Education and Training Board on 2nd October, 2019 and at a further meeting on 2nd October, 2019 the board completed the appointment of the new Finance and Audit and Risk Committees.

Key Control Procedures

The Board has taken steps to ensure an appropriate control environment by:

- Clearly identifying management and staff responsibilities.
- Establishing procedures for reporting significant control failures and ensuring appropriate action.
- Establishing procedures for identifying and evaluating all risks which could prevent Limerick & Clare ETB from achieving its objectives.

The system of internal control operated in Limerick & Clare ETB is based on:

- Detailed administrative procedures
- Segregation of duties
- Specific authorisations
- Internal checks
- Monthly management review of reports outlining the actual and budgeted results of programmes operated by Limerick & Clare ETB.

The Board's monitoring and review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control is informed by the:

- Recommendations made by the Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General in management letters or other reports.
- Work of the Audit & Risk Committee, which considers internal audit reports and reports of the Comptroller & Auditor General and reports to the Board whether the Chief Executive is, in the internal auditor's opinion, operating adequate and appropriate systems of internal control.
- Chief Executive who has responsibility for the financial control framework.

An internal audit service is provided by the Internal Audit Unit (IAU) - Education and Training Boards. The following internal audit review has been carried out since 1st January, 2019.

Procurement including Capital Projects, rent and leases; the audit was conducted in the second half of 2019 and LCETB is awaiting the draft internal audit report and findings.

Internal Audit

An Internal Audit function is provided by the Internal Audit Unit – Education and Training Boards." "The audit findings are based on the IAU-ETBs terms of reference and the internal audit unit provides an overall audit opinion on the area audited". "The overall opinion is based on the findings identified during the audit and the range of possible opinions are as follows:

Comprehensive – system of internal control is adequate and operates effectively

Adequate - system of internal control is generally adequate and operates effectively

Inadequate - system of internal control is inadequate and does not operate effectively"

The Youthreach Audit was conducted in 2018, and draft findings were received in April, 2019 and the Management response was sent back to the IAU with backup disputing some of the findings. The final findings and recommendations were issued in July, 2020 and categorised as Adequate with 3 high, 5 medium and 5 low. In the period since the audit was conducted these findings have since been resolved.

A procurement compliance audit was conducted in 2019 with the final findings and recommendations issued in May, 2020 and categorised as Comprehensive with 1 high, 5 medium and 6 low. These findings have since been resolved.

Non-compliance with procurement guidelines

The amount of non-compliant procurement in 2019 was €1,462,522. The breakdown of this figure is as follows: School Transport €704,951, ICT Maintenance €447,083, Legal Fees €46,846, Electrical Services €73,406, Refridgeration Spares & Maintenance €49,828, Tools & Class consumables €77,072, Hairdressing Supplies, €31,182 and Printing Services €32,154.

LCETB is prioritising these areas for procurement. A sectoral transport procurement process was co-ordinated by ETBi and the Education Procurement Service (EPS) who worked with individual ETBs. LCETB's Bus Hire Framework is now in place since 1st December, 2020.

LCETB completed drawdown of the ETBi tendered Legal frameworks and contracts were completed at end of 2019, the ETB has not had cause to drawn down from the framework to date.

The Department of Public Expenditure & Reform (DPER) have given approval for LCETB to go to tender for ICT Maintenance Support Services. The full tender process has been completed in 2020.

LCETB continues to monitor non-compliance with procurement guidelines.

Protected Disclosures

In accordance with the provisions of the Protected Disclosures Act 2014, Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board has appointed a designated officer for receiving protected disclosures and has put in place a policy "Policy for the Making of Protected Disclosures by Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board Workers" which is published on the ETB website. This policy, in tandem with the legislation, will encourage workers to report potential wrongdoing in the knowledge that their concerns will be taken seriously and investigated, where appropriate, and that their confidentiality will be respected. As required by section 22 of the Protected Disclosures Act 2014, Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board can confirm that no Protected Disclosures were made in 2019.

Single Public Service Pension Scheme

Circular Letter 11/2014 obliges ETBs to provide benefit statements and calculations to members of the Single Public Service Pension Scheme by the end of June 2014. In 2019 LCETB was 40% compliant and further work is continuing with a current compliance of 80%.

Risk management

LCETB has a Corporate Risk Management System in place across the organisation. The Risk Register was reviewed at each meeting of the Audit & Risk Committee in 2019 and the Committee continues to monitor the development of the LCETB Strategic Risk Management Plan.

Finance Committee Review

The Finance committee reviewed the 2019 Financial Statements of Limerick & Clare ETB on the 23rd March, 2020 and recommended their adoption by the Board and submission of these to the Comptroller and Auditor General for audit.

Annual Review of Controls

Limerick & Clare ETB is committed to operating an efficient, effective and economic internal control system. I confirm that the Audit & Risk Committee at its meeting on 25th February 2020, conducted a review of the effectiveness of the system of internal financial control for year ended 31 December 2019, in the manner prescribed by the Code of Practice for the Governance of Education & Training Boards. This included a review of internal and external audit reports along with an examination of minute books of the Board, Audit & Risk Committee and Finance Committee. The Audit & Risk Committee also got confirmation from the Chief Executive that on balance the system of internal control is adequate and appropriate. The Chief Executive based this statement on information gathered from senior managers across the organisation using customised questionnaires.

The Statement on Internal Control was reviewed and approved by the Board of LCETB at its meeting on 24th March 2020.

LCETB works diligently to ensure compliance with all aspects of circulars, codes of governance and legislation and any gaps identified in the regulatory framework are addressed as a matter of priority. Notwithstanding this, LCETB is not currently in a position to meet all of its responsibilities in respect of procurement regulations. There are instances where goods and services have been procured locally across 70 sites, in line with LCETB Purchasing Procedures but the cumulative value across all sites exceeds the national tendering threshold.

Given the nature of the organisation and the extent of spending under various categories and headings, full compliance will remain a challenge. LCETB will enhance its procedures for monitoring expenditure and tender for goods and services as required.

Opinion on the financial statements

I have audited the financial statements of Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board for the year ended 31 December 2019 as required under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. The financial statements comprise

- the related notes.

In my opinion,

- the financial statements properly present the income and expenditure of the Board for 2019 and the state of affairs of the Board at 31 December 2019, and
- the financial statements are in accordance with the accounting policies laid down by the Minister for Education.

Basis of opinion

I conducted my audit of the financial statements in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) as promulgated by the International Organisation of Supreme Audit Institutions. My responsibilities under those standards are described in the appendix to this report. I am independent of Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board and have fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the standards.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Report on information other than the financial statements, and on other matters

The Board has presented certain other information together with the financial statements. This comprises the statement of Board responsibilities, the statement on the system of internal control and a schedule of activities and pay costs. My responsibilities to report in relation to such information, and on certain other matters upon which I report by exception, are described in the appendix to this report.

Non-compliance with procurement rules

The statement on internal control discloses that in 2019 the Board incurred significant expenditure where the procedures followed did not comply with public procurement guidelines. The statement also sets out the steps taken or planned by the Board to address this matter.

Responsibilities of Board members

As detailed in the statement of Board responsibilities, the Board members are responsible for

- the preparation of the financial statements in the form prescribed under section 51 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013
- the keeping of proper books of account which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Board
- safeguarding the Board's assets and taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Responsibilities of the Comptroller and Auditor General

I am required under the Education and Training Boards Act 2013 to audit the financial statements of Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board and to report thereon to the Houses of the Oireachtas.

My objective in carrying out the audit is to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement due to fraud or error. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with the ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with the ISAs, I exercise professional judgment and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. In doing so,

- I identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements whether due to fraud or error; design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks; and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- I obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the internal controls.
- I evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures.

My opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information presented with those statements, and I do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with my audit of the financial statements, I am required under the ISAs to read the other information presented and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or with knowledge obtained during the audit, or if it otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work I have performed, I conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, I am required to report that fact.

Reporting on other matters

My audit is conducted by reference to the special considerations which attach to State bodies in relation to their management and operation. I report if I identify material matters relating to the manner in which public business has been conducted.

I seek to obtain evidence about the regularity of financial transactions in the course of audit. I report if I identify any material instance where public money has not been applied for the purposes intended or where transactions did not conform to the authorities governing them.

I also report by exception if, in my opinion,

- I have not received all the information and explanations I required for my audit, or
- the accounting records were not sufficient to permit the financial statements to be readily and properly audited, or
- the financial statements are not in agreement with the accounting records.

2 Other Services

Agency work involves running a programme on behalf of another organisation or students, according to agreed criteria and the Board is reimbursed its cost.

Self - financing Projects are programmes run under the complete control of the Board either for the Board or other organisations.

The ETB did not make pension contributions in respect of its employees in 2019. Since 2013 all new entrants are obliged to join the Single Public Pension Scheme.

From 1 January 2019 onwards, members of public service defined pension scheme pay an additional superannuation contribution (ASC) arising from the public service stability agreement (2018- 2020) and the public service pay and pension act 2017. ASC replaced the pension related deduction (PRD) which ceased in 2018. While PRD was a temporary emergency measure, ASC is a permanent contribution in respect of pensionable remuneration. The amount collected in 2019 was €2,997,492 which was remitted to the Department of Education and Skills.

Financial Statements - Year Ended 31 December 2019

Establishment of the Education and Training Board and the Accounting Policies

1. Establishment of the Education and Training Board

Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board (LCETB) was established on 1 July 2013 and its functions are set our in section 10 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

2 Community National Schools came under the Patronage of the LCETB with the commencement of the 2019/2020 academic year.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements are presented in the form approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform. They consist of a Statement of Accounting Policies, an Operating Statement, a Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities and notes to the financial statements.

Where necessary, the comparative figures for the previous year have been restated on the same basis of those for the current year.

(b) Basis of Preparation

The Operating Statement presents Receipts and Payments by Programme Grouping and the resultant Cash Surplus / (Deficit) is adjusted for other debtor and creditor movements to determine the overall result for the period on an accrual basis.

The Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities is prepared on the accruals basis by determining state grant and other funder balances at amounts that reflect the related expenditure incurred in accordance with the funding rules.

Third Party Debtors are included in Current Assets. Pay and Expense Liabilities are included in Current Liabilities.

(c) Tangible fixed assets

All assets purchased including land and buildings, fixtures and fittings and training equipment are expended for in the year of purchase. State grants to fund the purchase of tangible fixed assets are recognised in the same year.

(d) Stocks

All consumable stocks are expensed as purchased.

(e) Superannuation

The pension entitlements of ETB staff, including those who transferred from SOLAS, are conferred under defined benefit schemes. Staff employed since 2013 are included in the Single Public Service Pension Scheme and monthly payments are made to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

Superannuation deductions made from employees pay in respect of these schemes are retained by the ETB as part of agreed Exchequer funding, or paid over to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform in the case of Single Public Service Pension Scheme

The ETB does not make any contributions towards the schemes.

These unfunded schemes are operated on a pay as you go basis with the annual pension entitlements being paid by the National Shared Services Office on behalf of the ETB. ETBs are responsible for the administration of their pensions. Pension funds are provided by the Department of Education and Skills.

Provision has not been made in the financial statements for the present cost of the future benefits that have accrued to staff members and existing pensioners under these schemes.

(f) Lease Rentals

All lease rentals are expensed as incurred.

37 Events after the year end

Since the end of the reporting period, the economy and the ETB sector have been significantly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

However, LCETB continues to carry out it's vital role in education and training while being focused on ensuring continuity of education for learners, including a particular focus on more vulnerable students.

The effects of the pandemic will have financial implications for LCETB in 2020 and beyond. The financial impacts of COVID-19 commenced in March 2020 and given the unprecedented uncertainty of the situation that LCETB finds itself in, a reliable estimate of the costs and savings arising from SOVID-19 cannot not be made at this time. However, the main factors giving rise to additional costs and reduction in income are as follows.

Additional unplanned expenditure on ICT equipment and software support to enable the continuation of learning for students and the safety of its employees by remote working.

Additional costs to deliver training as it is expected that extra training allowances to participants in further education and training programmes will continue until courses are completed which may lead to some additional costs over the summer months.

Anticipated reductions in income. LCETB anticipates a reduction in self-generated income as some programmes are on hold and the Outdoor Education Centres have temporarily closed. PLC fee income is also likely to be reduced as more participants become eligible for free fees.

It is anticipated that the additional costs will be partially offset by savings in the areas of

- · substitution costs,
- \cdot consumables and costs incurred for contract management services and
- · savings associated with the delivery of apprenticeships as most craft apprentices are released to their employers and there are no further intakes currently (It should be noted that this delay is likely however to lead to greater costs in 2021).

LCETB has taken the following steps to manage the effects of the pandemic

From the commencement this crisis LCETB engaged its business continuity plan to ensure that its operations continued as normal in line with its regulatory requirements.

The Audit and Risk Committee has reviewed the updated LCETB's risk register to take account of the specific risks arising and LCETB will develop and ensure implementation of additional control measures as required.

The Department of Education and Skills has put in place a range of steering and engagement structures to support the education and training system in navigating the challenges of COVID-19. LCETB is participating in these structures to ensure a joined-up approach across the education sector.

In the medium to long term, the ETB sector will have a significant role to play in the overall tertiary system response needed for labour market activation which will form part of a broader cross government and cross agency response. As a result, there will be a particular focus on effective management of resources and capacity.
