#### **Annual Review of Controls**

Limerick & Clare ETB is committed to operating an efficient, effective and economic internal control system. I confirm that the Audit Committee at it's meeting in March 2017, conducted a review of the effectiveness of the system of internal financial control for year ended 31 December 2016, in the manner prescribed by the Code of Practice for the Governance of Educating & Training Boards. This included a review of internal and external audit reports along with an examination of minute books of the Board, Audit Committee and Finance Committee. The Audit Committee also got confirmation from the Chief Executive that on balance the system of internal control is adequate and appropriate. The Chief Executive based this statement on information gathered from senior managers across the organisation using customised questionnaires.

Issues disclosed in the 2015 Annual Accounts Statement of Internal Control, have been addressed and the ETB will continue to enhance the control framework.

LCETB works diligently to ensure compliance with all aspects of circulars, codes of governance and legislation and any gaps identified in the regulatory framework are addressed as a matter of priority. Notwithstanding this, LCETB is not currently in a position to meet all of its responsibilities in respect of procurement regulations. There are instances where goods and services have been procured locally across 70 sites, in line with LCETB Purchasing Procedures but the cumulative value across all sites exceeds the national tendering threshold.

Purchases for which no tender was undertaken amounted to circa €829,000. These specific areas were school bus hire and school books.

LCETB is prioritising these areas for procurement and expects to conclude tenders for same in 2018. Given the nature of the organisation and th extend of spending under various categories and headings, full compliance will remain a challenge. LCETB will continue to monitor all areas of expenditure and tender for goods and serices as required.

## **Delay in preparation of Financial Statements**

Limerick & Clare ETB submitted the financial statements for the Year ended 31 December 2016 to the C&AG for audit in October 2017. The delay in preparing the financial statements arose due to backlog of work associated with the amalgamation of the three former Vocational Education Committees, and taking on the operations and systems of two former SOLAS Training Centres. LCETB intend to submit the 2017 Financial Statements by due date.

# Establishment of the Education and Training Board and the Accounting Policies of the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31st December 2016

### 1. Establishment of the Education and Training Board

Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board (LCETB) was established on 1 July 2013 and its functions are set out in section 10 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

#### 2. Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements are presented in the form approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform. They consist of a Statement of Accounting Policies, an Operating Statement, a Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities and notes to the financial statements. Where necessary, the comparative figures for the previous year have been restated on the same basis as those for the current year.

#### (b) Basis of Preparation

The Operating Statement presents Receipts and Payments by Programme Grouping and the resultant Cash Surplus / (Deficit) is adjusted for other debtor and creditor movements to determine the overall result for the period on an accrual basis.

The Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities is prepared on the accruals basis by determining state grant and other funder balances at amounts that reflect the related expenditure incurred in accordance with the funding rules.

Third Party Debtors are included in Current Assets. Pay and Expense Liabilities are included in Current Liabilities.

#### (c) Tangible fixed assets

All assets purchased including land and buildings, fixtures and fittings and training equipment are accounted for in the year of purchase. State grants to fund the purchase of tangible fixed assets are recognised in the same year.

#### (d) Stocks

All consumable stocks are expensed as purchased.

#### (e) Superannuation

The pension entitlements of ETB staff, including those who transferred from SOLAS, are conferred under defined benefits schemes.

Superannuation deductions made from employees pay in respect of these schemes are retained by the ETB as part of agreed Exchequer funding, or paid over to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

The ETB does not make any contributions towards the schemes.

These unfunded schemes are operated on a pay as you go basis with the annual pension entitlements being paid directly by the Department of Education and Skills.

#### (f) Lease Rentals

All lease rentals are expensed as incurred.
