#### Schools and Youth Work

#### Website

A website for Glenroe Community National School (<a href="www.glenroecns.ie">www.glenroecns.ie</a>) was launched in May to provide information for prospective parents and the general public regarding the development of the school.

# **Post Primary Schools**

## **Board of Management Training**

Planning is underway to deliver the second round of Board of Management Training via an online platform such as Zoom later in the Autumn. This is subject to the changing situation with Covid-19 and will be guided by public health advice.

## Principals and Deputy Principals Meetings

Regular contact with school principals and deputy principals has been on-going since 13 March 2020 to ensure that schools are supported as effectively as possible.

Principals and Deputy Principals continued to attend regular online meetings regarding the management of the Junior Certificate School Report, the Leaving Certificate Calculated Grades process, end of year assessments, supports for incoming First Year students and parents and end-of-year graduations for Transition Year students and Sixth Year students. Schools invested highly commendable effort and time in acknowledging the achievements of students during the course of their studies in school.

The first Principals and Deputy Principals meeting for the academic year 2020-2021 is scheduled for 21 August 2020. Supports for schools are in the process of being tailored for the commencement of the new academic year.

# **Staffing Appeal**

The Staffing Appeal for additional teaching resources for Post Primary Provision for 2020/2021 has concluded and apportioned to schools in accordance with Circular 0015/2020 - Approved Allocation of Teaching Posts 2020/21 school year in Education and Training Boards.

Draft Admission Policy (DAP) - in accordance with the requirements of the Education Act 2018

All schools have returned a copy of the Draft Admission Policy (DAP) including schools where Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board is a co-patron. On-line meetings have been facilitated between Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board and the representatives of the other patrons to review the Draft Admission Policy (DAP) documentation. Recommendations, where agreed and applicable, have been returned to the schools.

#### Leaving Certificate Results

The Board expressed its dissatisfaction with the new date for the Leaving Certificate results. Concern was expressed with regard to the possibility of a challenge to teachers involved in the leaving certificate results as schools will be open. It was noted however that a portal would be open for students to receive their results.

Concern was also expressed re IT provision in schools and grants for same.

#### Youth Work

The Youth Work Team has been very busy with the Local Youth Club Grant Scheme 2020. The Team is using Microsoft Teams and Zoom for regular meetings with youth organisations and the Youth Work Coordination Group.

In 2019, Limerick and Clare ETB, through its Youth Work Function, supported;

- Sixteen special youth projects to provide targeted support to 9,565 young people
- The delivery of two Youth Information Services that supported queries from 3,734 individual young people
- Four National Sporting organisations and Limerick Sports Partnership to engage with 14,282 young people
- 94 Volunteer-led Clubs/Groups representing
- 1,200 community-based, volunteer youth leaders, and
- 5,800 young people engaging in volunteer-led youth work.

The Youthwork Team published its latest Newsletter earlier this month with updates on the development of the new funding scheme for youth organisations - UBU (Your Place Your Space).

Recently, the Youth Work Team launched a dedicated Facebook site to communicate with the wider community and to promote its activities online given that communities are relying more on social media platforms for communications. The Facebook page can be followed by searching for - @LimClareETBYouthWork.

# Local Creative Youth Partnership - LCYP

The partnership includes representatives from local authorities, youth work, early years, arts and education; as well as from several areas within Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board. Working partners include Limerick Youth Service, Clare Youth Service and Foróige, with whom the LCYP has already delivered creative programmes in dance, photography, drama, craft, makeup, film and in a range of visual art genres. The choice of creative activity undertaken by groups is based on data collected through consultation with over 300 young people across 26 youth work settings in both counties. In tandem with its focus on the youth sector, the LCYP develops creative programmes in Early Learning settings and works closely with Clare Childcare Committee and Limerick Childcare Committee in this regard. Dance for babies under two and storytelling for pre-school children have been explored through two conferences for ELC staff in 2019 and these areas remain a primary focus of the LCYP programme going forward.

The Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board Local Creative Youth Partnership pioneered a range of on-line events to support engagement in the creative arts amongst young people in the region during June. These included;

Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board's Schools Division has marked the exciting launch of Ireland's Google Educator Group website – www.geg.ie. The website was launched by Google for Education Ireland on Tuesday 16th at a webinar for educators throughout Ireland looking at Blended Learning for the new academic year. This is the first approved Google Educator Group for Ireland.

Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) has become an essential component of the toolkit that teachers must use now to engage students of all levels, particularly with school closures and the need to provide Distance Learning.

GEGs are independently run communities of educators who inspire and empower each other to meet the needs of students through technology, both in the classroom and beyond, via face to face meet-ups and online activities. GEGs provide a way for educators who are passionate about education and technology to meet like-minded people to share, learn and collaborate with one another. GEG Ireland endeavours to provide fellow educators with the most accurate, up-to-date information and best-practice in integrating technology into teaching and learning. The group actively shares innovative knowledge and expertise in using Google for Education tools.

#### Information, Recruitment & Guidance

- The IRG were the first point of contact for all learners recruited as part of the Mid-West Response to COVID-19.
- Online Course Campaign: The Mid-West COVID-19 Task Group generated over 2,100 'Expression of Interest' queries. The IRG HUB service provided individual information and guidance services to unemployed and furloughed clients.
- IRG developed online resources for learners

- III. On-line presentations on CVs and applications, telephone and video interviews, funding your further studies and used the IRGSS Facebook page as the platform to make these available to FET learners across the region.

 MGCE Harp ensemble took part in an online performance as part of Cruinniu na nÓg on 13 June. The performance is available to view on YouTube, as well as both the Creative Ireland Clare Facebook page and the Cruinniu na nÓg Facebook page. All 20 Creative Hub participants received online classes instead of the usual Saturday classroom based lessons to complete the term.

# 7. Governance - COVID-19 Update

The Chief Executive briefed Member on the measures and supports to date within the organisation. The CE advised that SOLAS has a new framework "skills to compete" in response to the dramatic economic downturn and unemployment rates and was responding with safer learning and remote working.

The CE informed the Board that safe learning was happening across the organisation, as was remote working and the CE paid tribute to all staff in relation to same.

The Board Members paid tribute to staff across the organisation and referred to the positive feedback that they had received, in particular the response to the cancellation of the Junior and Leaving Certificate and supports to students in this regard. The Board expressed their appreciation to all staff across the organisation. The Board again expressed their appreciation to the Chief Executive and Senior Management for their leadership, which was very much evident.

The CE stated that while we are operating during unprecedented times, statutory deadlines e.g. allocations, reporting to DES, had to be complied with.

The CE paid tribute and acknowledged those involved in the recruitment process which was completed through online interviews. The Director of Organisation Support and Development paid particular tribute to colleagues in the Human Resources Department and to the various interview board members. She advised that training on the online interview process would be rolled out to other Board Members but that this was not possible heretofore due to restrictive deadlines and Global Pandemic.

# 10. Update re Glenroe Community National School

Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board is pleased to announce the appointment of Julie O'Connor as Head Teacher of Glenroe Community National School, which is scheduled to open this September. The appointment follows confirmation in April by the Minister for Education and Skills, Joe McHugh TD, of the intention to establish a CNS in Glenroe as a result of an extensive period of engagement between the local working group from Glenroe/Ballyorgan Community Council, the Diocese of Limerick, Department officials and Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board.

Julie O'Connor is a graduate of St Patrick's College and holds a Master's Degree in Education. She has experience of teaching a wide range of class groups, having previously taught in Ashbourne, County Meath, and most recently in Mallow Convent Primary School. Julie brings considerable experience to the role as a coordinator of the Teaching Council's Droichead programme, the integrated professional induction framework for newly qualified teachers, and as a member of the Board of Management of Mallow Convent Primary School.

Ms O'Connor is very excited to be taking up the position of Head Teacher at the new school. She said: "I am looking forward to establishing the school and to welcoming the children on their first day in Glenroe Community National School. It is an historic development and I am delighted to play a part in this. It will be a fantastic opportunity to work with the local community, the parents/guardians of the school children and the ETB to enable the children of Glenroe and Ballyorgan to be educated locally once more." She is looking forward to meeting parents/guardians at the school's registration evening on Wednesday 24 June at 8pm in Glenroe Community Hall.

The communities of Glenroe and Ballyorgan had their first opportunity to meet newly-appointed Glenroe Community National School Head Teacher, Julie O'Connor, at the school's registration evening on Wednesday 24 June at 8pm in Glenroe Community Hall. The socially-distanced event
