Some of our **highlights** included the Sketch Art Programme; distribution of activity packs to young people and Evan and Sean's cookery activities.

One to one chats and check ins by Melissa were key for a lot of our older teenagers. In our centre, we have also taken the opportunity to begin some refurbishment and repairs over the past weeks, and we hope that a new fresh look will be a treat for young people and adults alike, as they filter back indoors to us in the coming weeks.

Anything exciting coming up for the summer?

Outdoors summer programme including sports, gardening and arts activities will take place in partnership with STEPS school completion and Limerick Sports Partnership – guided by Public Health advice.

July & August – weekly sessions with young people including kayaking, fishing and youth work games on the pitch

What are you all looking forward to?

We can't wait to see, hear from and engage with young people. We are delighted to get to work together as a new team in 'direct contact' youth work for the first time. **Autumn:** youth groups returning, new youth work provision emerging, and linking with our community and voluntary partners especially Southill Hub Youth Work team who have kept in contact and shared ideas with us.
